Corrective Action Plan Summary Sheet

Continue to evaluate curriculum to include appropriate pharmacology strategies. Pharmacology to be covered for each concept is listed in the curriculum documents. These inclusions are guided by the NCLEX-RN test plan. A pharmacology exam is now administered to include medications for concepts and exemplars covered during that semester. (Continuous)

A NCLEX-RN test taking strategy review session by faculty is required of each student during NUR 213 (3:1 student/faculty ratio). (Spring 2015)

Require a NCLEX review with pre and post assessment, to be used as a tool to address continued areas of weakness to assist in developing individual plans of improvement. (Spring 2015)

Simulated mock NCLEX-RN day in which students complete a comprehensive NCLEX-RN style assessment in a setting that is set-up as a testing center. Require remediation for students not meeting benchmark. (Spring 2016)

Increase faculty professional development in teaching and learning strategies by attending concept-based teaching workshops, College-sponsored professional enrichment and attending monthly webinars. (Continuous)

Implement the use of Adaptive Quizzing to increase student exposure to NCLEX style items. (Fall 2015)

Mandatory remediation for students who score less than 80% on any test in the nursing curriculum. Supplemental instruction hours each week for students to access faculty outside of schedule student conference hours for additional assistance in nursing courses. (Fall 2014)

Ensuring that clinical or simulation experiences are available for areas of weakness. Including incorporating more clinical time in the outpatient, long-term, pediatric and psychiatric settings (Spring 2016)

Curriculum and course evaluations to occur each semester ensuring alignment with NCLEX-RN test plan. (Continuous)

Increased test time across the curriculum to ensure students have adequate time to read and answer test items. (Spring 2016)

Implement computer-based testing to simulate NCLEX exam for all nursing unit tests (Fall 2016)
