#### **NC AHEC Nursing Clinical Partnership Project**

Through the NC AHEC Nursing Clinical Partnership Project, NC AHEC has committed funding to build an infrastructure of robust academic-practice nursing partnerships across the state, with a focus on developing the clinical faculty workforce for students seeking Licensed Practical Nursing, Associate Degree in Nursing, and/or Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing. Funding is available for nursing schools in the NC Community College System and the University of North Carolina System.
