\*The North Carolina Board of Nursing (NCBON) supervises the licenses of licensed practical nurses and registered nurses. The NCBON also supervises the nurse aide II listings, approvals to practice for nurse practitioners, and the recognition of certified registered nurse anesthetists and clinical nurse specialists.

\*\*\*North Carolina is a member of the nurse licensure compact. Active-duty military, military veterans, and military spouses who wish to work in North Carolina on their compact nursing license do not need to apply to the NCBON for an additional license to work in the state. Information in this report reflects active-duty military, military veterans, and military spouses who applied directly for a North Carolina license by endorsement instead of practicing on a compact license. The NCBON licensure application was updated to gather information in accordance with Session Law 2022-6, signed into law March 17, 2022.

Revenues are recognized in the accounting period in which they are earned and become measurable. Licenses are renewed for a period of two years. License renewal fees are deferred and recognized as revenue over the two-year period to which they relate.
