

## Technical Specifications

### Internet Explorer

1. Open Internet Explorer.
2. Click the Internet Explorer Tools  button and select **Manage add-ons**.
3. Under the **Toolbars and Extensions** option, click on the **Show** drop-down list and select **Run without permissions**.
4. In the displayed list of add-ons and extensions, find **Adobe PDF Reader**.
5. Select the extension and click the **Disable** button in the bottom right of the Manage Add-ons window.
6. Find **Adobe PDF Reader** in the list and click the **Disable** button to prevent PDFs from loading within Internet Explorer

### Chrome

1. Open Google Chrome.
2. Click on the **Menu** icon () in the top-right corner of the Window.
3. Click **Settings**.
4. Scroll down to the bottom of the Settings window and click **Advanced**.
5. In the *Privacy and security* section, click **Content Settings**.
6. Scroll down and click the **PDF documents** option.
7. Change the "Download PDF files instead of automatically opening them in Chrome" option from the off position (grey) to the on position (blue).
8. Close the Settings tab and now any PDF should be downloaded instead of being opened in Chrome.

### Firefox

1. Open Mozilla Firefox.
2. Click the menu  button and select **Options**.
3. Within the Options window, click **Applications**
4. Under the Content Type column, select the **Portable Document Format (PDF)** option.
5. In the Action column, click the down arrow on the right-hand side of the box.
6. In the drop-down menu that appears, select your new default PDF reading program (**Use Adobe Acrobat**).

## Safari on Mac OS

1. In the Finder, select a PDF, and choose File > Get Info.
2. Click the arrow next to Open With to expose the product menu.
3. Choose either Adobe Acrobat or Adobe Acrobat Reader from the application menu.
4. Click the **Change All** button.
5. When asked if you want to change all similar documents, click **Continue**.

## Safari on Mac – Browser Preferences

1. Launch Safari and choose Safari > Preferences.
2. In the Preferences window, click **Security**, and then click **Website Settings** next to Internet plug-ins.
3. Select Adobe Reader in the list of plug-ins. Under When Visiting Other Websites, in the drop-down list choose **Allow Always** and click **Done**.
4. The browser is now set to use the Adobe Reader plug-in to display PDFs.
